Playing outside: A Rainy Day Review

Hello everyone, and Happy October! The weather is changing rapidly; fall is definitely in the air!

As such, now is a good time to remind everyone of our "Rain or Shine" policy for lunch and recess. This means that we do send students outside during lunch and recess times **even if it is raining**. Exceptions will be made in extremely rainy or stormy weather and on days when it is raining steadily, it is more likely that an "inside day" will be called during the lunch hour, when students' time outside is longer than at recess.

The benefits of outdoor play are well researched. These benefits include: better social and emotional regulation skills; improved concentration; lower rates of obesity, diabetes and other health issues; better gross motor coordination skills; stronger awareness, reasoning and observation skills; and an increased appreciation for our natural environment. In addition to this, we know that particularly in the afternoon, students need fresh air and some exercise to keep them energized through to the end of the day.

Please help ensure that students are appropriately prepared for outdoor weather when they come to school. This would include wearing warm, water-repellant or waterproof jackets and footwear for outdoors, as well as gloves, hats and scarves (depending on the temperature). It is also important on wet days that students bring a change of clothes and footwear to school, just in case.

Parks and Recreation Credit

You can pick up your application form from Maria, our Community School Coordinator, in the Community Office, or you can apply when you register at the Burnaby Christmas Bureau. You must bring the following information with you:

- Recent phone or hydro bill showing current Burnaby address
- Copy of 2016 T1 General Tax form for each adult, or Income Assistance cheque stub
- 2016 Notice of Assessment for each adult
- Canada Child Tax Benefit and BC Family Bonus Notice for each child.



Burnaby Christmas Bureau Registration

The Burnaby Christmas Bureau offers gifts for children of families with low income. Registration will be Monday to Friday, November 15th - December 18th, 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Saturdays, 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at Metropolis at Metrotown, Upper Level between Winners/Homesense and Big Orange Juice Bar.

Qualified applicants will receive new toys for their children (16 years and younger).

Eligibility:

- Burnaby families with low incomes and children 16 years and younger
- Low income Seniors
- Income Assistance or family with low-income

Working Families must provide a C-Print for each adult. To obtain one call: 1-800-959-8281 (Press * to speak to an Operator). If you are on Income Assistance, a Release of Information form from your Ministry Office will replace the C-Print. You will need your children's care cards, birth certificate, passport, etc., and proof of current address. **For more information call M.J. at 604-292-3902.**

Hallowe'en Safety

It's trick or treat time again! Here are some tips from your school health nurse for a fun and safe Halloween:

How to make your costume safe:

- Make sure that drivers can see your child. Use costumes with reflective tape and give each child a flashlight.
- Make sure your child can see. Use face paint instead of masks.
- To prevent falling, costumes should not be longer than your child's ankle.

How to make trick or treating safe:

- Children should stay in well-lit areas and only visit homes that have their outside lights turned on. Children should never go inside any house.
- If you are driving on Halloween night, please be extra careful. Children are excited at Halloween and may forget some of the safety rules.

- Before your children eat their candy, make sure you examine it. Throw out any treats that are not wrapped.

*****An adult should always supervise younger children.**



The following is the **City of Burnaby's Fireworks bylaw: Bylaw No.8047**

A Bylaw respecting the prevention and suppression of fire and the preservation of life and property.

Part V Fireworks and Firecrackers

14.

- (1) In this section,
 - a) firecrackers means small fireworks with entwined fuses used solely as noisemaker and not for pyrotechnic effect;
 - b) fireworks means manufactured goods intended to be used for a pyrotechnic effect that are classified by the Canada Explosives Regulations as low hazard fireworks for recreation (Class 7.2.1) such as firework showers, fountains, golden rain, lawn light, pin wheel, Roman candles, volcanoes and sparklers.
- (2) No person shall
 - a) offer for sale or sell fireworks, or
 - b) use, set off or discharge fireworks.
- (3) Subsection (2) does not apply during the period commencing the 25th day of October and ending the 31st day of October
 - a) to an offer to sell or a sale of fireworks to a person who is at least 18 years of age, or
 - b) to the using, setting off or discharging of fireworks on private property with the knowledge and consent of the owner.
- (4) No person shall offer for sale, sell, use, detonate or explode firecrackers.
