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**FSA exam - Fundamental Skills Assessment** (for grade 4 and grade 7 students)

- teacher created: involves literacy (reading + writing) and numeracy (math)
- collect information for school districts as well as provincially
- part of the exam is online, and part of the exam is open book where information read to them or they read themselves and then they answer the questions in exam book
- you can't study for it since it's an assessment looking at schools skills learned in our system
- students have working on them from kindergarten up until the end of grade 3 and the grade 7s the assessment is of everything they have been learning up to the end of grade 6
- schools and parents get the results of FSA assessment before Christmas break
- our school district looks at results of FSAs and puts resources towards the schools
- FNEESC, First Nations Education Steering Committee absolute support FSA
- use it as measure since direct correlation students on how well they're doing and Gr.12 grad,
- we can provide some supports for students who want to do the FSA but we would never put a student who is unable to meaningfully engage in part or all FSA's in that situation
- ex.:Gr 7 ELL student, consultation with teachers to write certain parts of the exam like math

**Construction of New school**

- took a tour of the site: it's going to be an amazing building
- so much thought that's been put into the design and layout
- looking forward sharing with all of you and your children
- completion date is end of February 2026 and occupancy date is April 2026(after spring break)

- Sandy has purchased a variety of large games for students to use at lunch break with youth grants, in
