# It's a Matter of "Principal"

Dear Families,

This month, we've been having meaningful conversations with students about a powerful word: **character**. While academic success is important, who our students are becoming as people is just as vital. At the heart of this is character.

So, what is character? It's not about being perfect. It's about doing the right thing, even when it's hard, even when no one is watching, and even when no one gives you credit for it. In other words, character is who you are when no one is supervising.

Throughout the day, there are many moments when students aren't being directly watched by an adult, at recess, in the hallways, during group work, or online. It's during these moments that true character reveals itself. Will a student include someone who's left out? Will they take responsibility for a mistake? Will they choose the right path, even when it's not the easiest one?

Just last week, I happened to be nearby when one of our students noticed some garbage left behind on the field after lunch. The student had no idea I was watching. Without being asked or prompted, they quietly picked up the wrappers, put them in the bin, and returned to class. That is character in action. We're encouraging students to ask themselves:

#### ...

- Will I do the right thing, even if no one sees?
- Will I admit a mistake, even if it's uncomfortable?

• Will I choose honesty and kindness, even when it's tough?

These aren't always easy questions, especially with peer pressure or strong emotions in the mix. That's why we work hard to create a school culture where kindness, responsibility, and integrity are not only talked about but practiced daily.

Character is built over time, shaped by small everyday decisions: returning something lost, standing up for someone, or telling the truth. It's in these quiet moments that character is truly formed.

Thank you, families, for your role in this work. When you talk with your child about values, set clear expectations, and model ethical choices at home, you're reinforcing what we teach at school. Together, we are helping our students grow into not just capable learners, but caring, trustworthy people. In the end, it's not what we say that defines us, but what we do, especially when no one is watching.
