

### **Back to School Reminder for Stride Families**

Please remember that the Staff Parking Lots are for **STAFF ONLY**. There is absolutely no parent parking in either of these two lots. There are signs at the entrance to both lots as reminders and we ask that parents pay attention to these and are respectful of the fact that these are staff parking spaces only.

For pick up time at 3.00 pm – we are requesting that parents wait at the very back of the basketball court near the blue construction fencing when they arrive at the school to pick up their child(ren). This area becomes quite congested when we have all our classes dismissing at the end of the day through the main doors. It would help greatly, if parents were to wait near the back of this areas to allow the teachers to get out into the courtyard with their classes, as this is the area that all the classes dismiss in. Students can then find their parent/guardian near the fencing at the back.

The bike rack and the railing as you enter the school, are two areas that students should not be climbing and playing on. This poses a safety hazard, and we do not want to see students injured. Playing here also prevents others from accessing these areas for their intended purposes.

Students using 'wheeled' modes of transportation to come to school – such as bikes, scooters, skateboards, etc., need to ensure they ARE NOT riding these while on school grounds. These need to be dismounted and walked while on school grounds to ensure the safety of all others who are walking. Bikes should be locked, and helmets are required when students are using this equipment as well.

### What is the Stride Avenue Community Council (SACC)?

The Stride Avenue Community Council (SACC) is an organization of parents, guardians and community members that represent the school. All parents or guardians of children enrolled in the school are automatically members of the SACC and are invited to attend the monthly SACC meeting. The SACC is led by an elected Executive Council (chair, treasurer, secretary, etc). This executive committee helps organize meetings, fundraisers, events and lead initiatives at the school.

### Purpose of the Stride Avenue Community Council (SACC):

- Represent parents' views to the school administration and staff.
- Support student success by working with the school on events, programs, and improvements.
- Fundraise for school resources, extracurricular activities, and special projects.
- Facilitate communication between parents, teachers, administration, and the school board.
- Organize school events, cultural celebrations, and parent workshops.

### Monthly SACC Meeting

All parents, guardians and community members are invited to monthly online SACC meetings. The principal and head teacher also join and share important updates and information about the school. These meetings are a great way to be involved in the school, ask questions and to learn more about our school and community. All parents and guardians are encouraged to attend.

The SACC Annual General Meeting is **Thursday**, **September 25**<sup>th</sup> **On-line**. A formal agenda and the link to the meeting will be emailed to all family members.
